During his career in the service, our Brother served with Airborne, Ranger and Special Forces Infantry units from 1963 to 1970. He is a combat infantry veteran with one and a half years of combat survival.

After leaving the Army, he continued his education and attended New York University School of Dentistry. He graduated in June 1974 with a Doctor of Dental Surgery degree and the recipient of the "Charles Hull Award" for outstanding clinical endodontics. After graduation, Brother Joe was asked to join the faculty at NYU and teach dentistry...quite an honor for a new graduate.



Brother Joseph Almaguer was the Worshipful Master of Hillsborough Lodge No. 25 in 1998, and he continues to inspire young Brothers with his regular participation in Lodge.

In 1975, Brother Joe moved away from the cold North and came to Florida. Since that time, he has practiced General and Cosmetic Dentistry. His love of Dentistry keeps him working albeit only three days a week.

Worshipful Joe has a lovely wife, four children, and seven wonderful grandchildren which he tries not to spoil. He is a third generation Freemason and takes pride in knowing both of his sons and son-in-law are Masons.

Thank you to all the Brothers, their families and friends who attended the Installation of Officers for 2012. The Installation was a great success and a shining moment for our Lodge.



As you all know, it is Valentine's Day, and I encourage all of you to be with those you love most and who have supported you throughout the years.

This month is especially important in Masonry, as it involves the birthday of one of the most famous and inspiring Masons in our history, Brother George Washington. Brother Washington was born on February 11, 1731, according to the then used Julian calendar date; however, as all the colonies adopted the Gregorian calendar, his birth date was moved to February 22, 1732. Brother Washington was born in Westmoreland County, Colony of Virginia. Brother Washington was a General in the Army, and later grew into the occupations of surveyor and planter. He adopted the Anglican/Episcopal religion, and was married to Martha Dandridge Custis Washington. After being home schooled, Brother Washington went on to be the Commander in Chief of the Continental Army, the President of Constitutional Convention, and later the 1st President of the United States. He is known as "The Father of His Country," and in recognition of his accomplishments, his face is carved on Mount Rushmore and printed on the one-dollar bill and quarter. He served two terms in office
