# MASONIC SPOTLIGHT:

On January 31st, Mr. Jeff Stuart attended our first family night of 2012 and presented the Lodge with a Past Masters Jewel belonging to W.: Joseph Robles. The Jewel is available for Brothers to view in the glass case, upstairs lobby of the Lodge. Below is a history of W.: Robles and his family:

The Robles are an old and important family in the history of the Tampa Bay area. W.: Joseph Robles was an immigrant from Malaga in the Andalusia region of Spain, who came to the United States in 1832. He lived with the Michael Garrison family and worked on their farm in return for food and shelter while he learned to speak English. W.: Robles married Mary Ann Garrison on December 12, 1841, at Fort Fanning, Florida. He and his new family made Florida their permanent home in 1850 after obtaining a Federal land patent in what is now Hernando County.

W.:. Robles was a man of about 5 foot 2 inches, small build and blue eyes. He fought during the Seminole War (1835-1842) and helped to defend a Tampa salt works plant from Yankee soldiers during the Civil War. It is said that he made a statement at the beginning of the Civil War that he did not agree with fighting against the country he had pledged to support,



but he had to follow the State in which he resided. While standing guard, W∴ Robles is credited with spotting a Yankee gun ship coming into what is now the corner of Bayshore and Gandy Boulevard. He was successful in capturing several Union soldiers and returned them to Fort Brooke as POWs.

W∴ Robles (pictured at right) was the Master of our Lodge in 1875 and 1880. He made significant contributions to this area during his lifetime, which earned him the honor of having his name commemorated on Robles Park in Tampa Heights and Robles Elementary School, located at 4405 Eest Sligh Avenue. At age 84, he was described as "a hale and hearty old man with hardly a gray hair to his head." W∴ Joseph Robles passed to the celestial Lodge above in 1907 at the age of 89.

Louis radiated an honesty of character, a natural aptitude for leadership, and the grace of movement of the athlete. Frank thought, "If I had a son, I would want him to be just like this lad."

They talked for a while about school. Louis told him of his aspirations for a place on the track team, of his position as a pitcher on a baseball team, and in response to a question said, "I am a fairly good student. Even with the hard time we are having, I want to finish high school and then help with the education of the others."

Frank responded, "It is a good goal. You will meet the challenge. Now, tell me about your father. I knew him but only from very casual meetings." Louis hesitated as though reluctant to look into the past but finally said, "My father was the finest father a boy ever had."

That evening, as Nell Land cleared the dinner dishes, she said, "Frankie, something happened today. You look like you have found a long, lost friend."


