Brother Washington was born in Westmoreland County, Colony of Virginia on February 11, 1731, according to the then used Julian calendar; however, as all the colonies adopted the Gregorian calendar, his birth date was moved to February 22, 1732. He adopted the Anglican/ Episcopal religion, and was married to Martha Dandridge Custis Washington. Although home schooled, Brother Washington went on to be the Commander in Chief of the Continental Army, the President of the Constitutional Convention, and later the first President of the United States. He is known as "The Father of His Country," and in recognition of his accomplish-

ments, his face is carved on Mount Rushmore, and printed on the one-dollar bill and quarter. He served two terms in office with no party affiliation from 1789 to 1797, with his Vice President, John Adams.



Lifting the Veil, Esoteric Masonic Thought on Initiation - Part 2

The philosopher Søren Kierkegaard wrote a small book titled purity of heart is to will one thing. What is it to purify the heart, and so to will one thing? Surely, it is to know what you want. What is your hearts desire? But that simple question what do you want? Is much easier to ask than to answer.

We all have so many desires for and against this and that, jostling and competing with one another. We are like young Aladdin, who found an old lamp from which, when he rubbed to clean it, emerged a powerful genie. Only when we make a wish, a suggestion to our subconscious, and the spirit turns to do our bidding, another voice within cries no wait! And substitutes a different wish, and then another, and so that mighty servant can only spin around like a whirlwind, doing nothing productive and maybe even knocking things over by accident.

All these competing voices, where do they come from? All our lives we have collected shoulds and shouldn'ts musts and cannots, like barnacles. Advertising and media suggest that we will feel happy and fulfilled if we have this or that possession to represent ourselves to others with the trappings of style and success. That smiling man, that smooth skinned, poised woman, they cannot possibly suffer the frustrations and petty conflicts that I have to deal with, and if I were successful like them it would all be smooth sailing for me too! That's not quite like rubbing dirt off an old lamp. Its more like a courtship. It takes time, and persistence, and you have to care.

Masonry communicates by symbol and allegory. What does this mean? Even though words are spoken in the ritual, they refer to symbols which communicate non verbally. We must read them the way illiterate people read stained glass and statuary in the middle ages. Our rituals represent to us, duly assembled with our brethren, what it is to be a mason. They display a pattern on the trestle board. These symbolic and allegorical representations are suggestive. As we pay attention to our Masonic rituals repeatedly, consistently in certain places and at certain regular times, workmen of the subconscious reconstitute us according to that pattern, building the temple not made with hands.

Initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason in the Lodge of Fredericksburg, Virginia, in November of 1752, he was Passed in March and Raised in August of 1753 in that same Lodge. He was proud of his membership, saying, "The object of Freemasonry is to promote the happiness of the human race," and in 1788 served as first Master of what is now known as Alexandria-Washington Lodge.

It was perhaps inevitable that, after Washington's magnificent contributions to the nation during the Revolutionary period, he should be named a Virginia Delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1787, where as Presiding Officer he played a key role in the success of the Convention and ultimately became our first President in 1789. Washington thus became the first Master of a Masonic Lodge to become President, holding, for a time, both that high office and that of Worshipful Master of his Lodge, a rare distinction indeed. Washington's words upon becoming President reflect well his philosophy: "Integrity and firmness are all that I can promise." What more could a nation ask?

From the very beginning, Masonry has been closely associated with the history of our nation. And never more dramatically evidenced than in 1793 when, wearing a Masonic apron presented to him by General Lafayette and embroidered by Madame Lafayette, Washington in a Masonic ceremony laid the cornerstone of the United States Capitol at Washington, D.C.

Washington had a deep sense of national union. In a response to an address of Charleston, South Carolina, Masons, he said: "The fabric of our freedom is placed on the enduring basis of public virtue, and will, I fondly hope, long continue to protect the prosperity of the architects who raised it." In Washington's famous Farewell Address on his retirement from public life, he emphasized that the responsibility for America's destiny rests directly upon its citizens, and he urged Americans to forge a nation of high principles: "Observe good faith and justice toward all nations. Cultivate peace and harmony with all. Religion and morality enjoin this conduct."

W∴ Washington passed to the celestial Lodge above on December 14, 1799 in Mount Vernon, Virginia. He served both God and man with the firmness of his convictions. During the darkest days of the Revolution and the cruel winter at Valley Forge, it was Washington who stood firm in the face of adversity and knelt for prayer in the snow to reaffirm his faith in God and seek divine assistance in the justice of his cause. As his hope was in God, so must we, too, place our hope in God. Washington carried in his heart the ideals of liberty, justice and freedom. As Masons, we must likewise carry forward those same ideals.
