# MASSNIC SDSTLIGHT: M.: MALTER SCHSEPF & BRS. KARF PERIACOWI

The Table Lodge, as we know it today, had a very different look and feel in the early years. The first Table Lodge at Hillsborough Lodge was held back in the early 1980s. However, this was a one-time event which did not continue as an annual event for the Lodge. Today's lavish meals and sequence of events can be attributed to one man, Worshipful Walter Schoepf. W.: Schoepf was raised in Hillsborough Lodge in 1998 and became Worshipful Master in 2005. Born and raised in Switzerland, W∴ Schoepf moved to the United States from the Bahamas where he worked in the culinary industry in the early 1970s, which was where he met Brother Karl Degiacomi. After working in the United States for several years, W∴ Schoepf ventured out into his own business and called to his side Brother Degiacomi to be his partner. Having spent much of his life in the food industry, he saw an opportunity to create an event that would later become one of the most anticipated Masonic events every year for Brothers near and far.

The first Table Lodge that Worshipful Schoepf put on was back in 2001. In the beginning, the program



Happy September Brothers All,



#### How to Build a Memory Palace

A memory palace is an imaginary location in your mind where you can store mnemonic images. The most common type of memory palace involves making a journey through a place you

know well, like a building or town. Along that journey there are specific locations that you always visit in the same order. The location are called loci, which is Latin for locations. (Singular: locus; Plural: loci)

# Constructing and Using the Palace

For your first memory palace, try choosing a place that you know well, like your home or office.

Plan out the whole route — for example: front door, shoe rack, bathroom, kitchen, living room, etc. Some people find that going clockwise is helpful, but it isn't necessary. Eventually, you will have many memory palaces. You will also be able to revise the memory palace after you test

it a few times, so don't worry if it's perfect on the first try.

Now take a list of something that you want to memorize — a shopping list of 20 items is a good place to start: carrots, bread, milk, tea, oats, apples, etc.

Take one or two items at a time and place a mental image of them in each locus of your memory palace. Try to exaggerate the images of the items and have them interact with the location. For example, if the first item is "carrots" and the first locus in your memory palace is the front door, picture some giant carrots opening up your front door.

Make the mnemonic images come alive with your senses. Exaggeration of the images and humor can help.

If you want to commit the items to your long term memory, used spaced repetition, and they will stick in your memory.
