His community involvement in professional and youth soccer leagues is unparalleled, as he has been a very active member of the Florida State Referees Association for over 30 years.

R: H: Newton began his Masonic career at a very early age in DeMolay. He was a member of the Paul Revere and Owen A. Coile Chapters. He served as Master Counselor, Chapter Scribe, and received a number of recognitions including P.M.C.M.S.A., R.D., Top Hat, and the Legion of Honor. He was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason at Hillsborough Lodge No. 25 on March 20th, 1973. R∴ H∴ Newton entered the Officers line, and as he has demonstrated, was very dedicated to learning ritual and business of the Lodge. He was elected the Worshipful Master in 1985. Since then, his 41-year Masonic career includes membership in the Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Valley of Tampa, the Egypt Temple Shrine, and served as President of Masters and Wardens.




