Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, or JDRF, is the leading global organization funding Type 1 diabetes (T1D) research. Its strength lies in its exclusive focus and singular influence on the worldwide effort to end T1D.

Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease that strikes both children and adults suddenly. It has nothing to do with diet or lifestyle. There is nothing you can do to prevent it, and at present, there is no cure. JDRF works every day to change the reality of this disease for millions of people, and to prevent anyone else from ever knowing it. JDRF engages in funding research, advocating for government support of research and new therapies, ensuring new therapies come to market and connecting and engaging the T1D community.

JDRF has led the search for a cure for T1D since its founding in 1970. In those days, people commonly called the disease "juvenile diabetes" because it was frequently diagnosed in, and strongly associated with, young children. The organization began as the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. Later, to emphasize exactly how it planned to end the disease, it added a word and became the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation.




