

Brother William Hesketh Lever was born on September 19, 1851, in the small town of Bolton, Manchester, England. He was the seventh child of grocer James Lever and Eliza Hesketh. Although an academic non-achiever at school, Lever threw himself into extracurricular activities and aspired to be an architect; however, his father had other plans. In 1867, Lever was recruited into the family grocery business, where one of his chores was to cut the large blocks of soap into slices and wrap them for sale. When Lever was aged 21, his father made him a junior partner in the business. With this, his salary rose to £800 a year and his dream of marrying his childhood sweetheart, Elizabeth Hulme, became a reality.

Looking at his father's humble empire, Lever's gaze fell upon one thing – soap. In 1885, along with his brother James, he established Lever Brothers and brought soap to the masses. After much market research and international travel, they began to corner the market. Sunlight Soap, the world's first packaged and branded laundry detergent, was born. Massively successful products helped launch subsidiaries in the US, Switzerland, Canada, Australia and Germany.


Lastly, a big thank you to Worshipful Master Baldwin and Brother Huster, and all the Brothers who contributed to the back-pack school drive. It was a success!

Missing this final chance to remain current on your dues means two things: 1) You will lose all Masonic rights and privileges including the

ability to attend meetings, vote, participate in appendant orders, and receive Masonic communication and Masonic burial services. 2) If you ever want to regain your status as a member in good standing, it means a lot of extra work for both you and the Lodge . . .

- You must file a Petition for Reinstatement with two signers from the Lodge;
- Your Petition for Reinstatement must be received by the Craft and layover for a Masonic Calendar (30 days);

- You must submit to and pay for an online criminal background check;
- You must be investigated by an Investigating Committee made up of three Brothers;
- Your Petition must be subjected to a ball ballot.

Is all that worth it? Well, yes, it is; but why go through it all when you can simply pay your dues and remain current? If you have not yet paid your 2017 dues, please do so immediately so that you will not be dropped from our rolls.

LIGHT IN MASONRY

- The conventional establishment of Freemasonry is usually dated to 1717, when the Grand Lodge of London emerged on the 24th June. The emergence of this Grand Lodge marks the beginning of Grand Lodges governing other Lodges.
- The third degree did not exist at the beginning of Freemasonry. In fact, it only started in the 1720s, and it took quite some time to spread through Masonic Lodges.
- Built in 1892, the Masonic Temple in Illinois, Chicago, used to be the world's tallest building. At the time it was built, it was 22 floors high.

This company is know today as Unilever, Britain's first multinational company.

It was in Port Sunlight that Lever's masonic career began when a group of local Masons, many of whom were employees of Lever Brothers, decided to open a Lodge in the village. To honour their chairman, they named it William Hesketh Lever Lodge, No. 2916. Lever was duly initiated at the first meeting of the Lodge in 1902 and went on to become Master in 1907. He later formed Leverhulme Lodge, No. 4438; was a co-founder of no fewer than 17 Lodges; became Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England; and was appointed Provincial Senior Grand Warden of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Cheshire.

Brother Lever saw Freemasonry as a useful tool to promote social cohesion and high standards of personal conduct and actively encouraged membership amongst his workforce. He established a Masonic network at Port Sunlight which deliberately reinforced the existing hierarchy within Lever Brothers. Separate Lodges were created for managers, supervisors and workers. Freemasonry was an important instrument in his paternalistic policy for the welfare of his workers.

Brother Lever passed to the Celestial Lodge above at his London residence in Hampstead on May 7, 1925.


